## Safety First! ●

Except during the brief total phase of a total solar eclipse, when the Moon completely blocks the Sun's bright face, it is not safe to look directly at the Sun without specialized eye protection for solar viewing.

- 2. Find Local Events in the Path of Totality
  - Find in-person and virtual NASA-related events that you can participate in before or during the eclipse.
- 3. Use NASA Eclipse Resources With Students 

  Build a pinhole camera to safely view the eclipse or learn about careers that study the sun, or what causes sun spots.
- 4. Be A Citizen Scientist and Collect Data

Collect and submit data on topis like air temperature and clouds during an eclipse.
